The purpose of the Mesquakie mission continues to be giving God's word and helping those who are lost to find Jesus and have a change of heart. We are thankful for the many ways God used people to help with the Mesquakie Friend's Center this past year. Some projects that needed immediate attention were done by three work teams last fall. Walls and ceilings were painted, a deck was stained, and a fence line was cleared of brush to be painted later. The barn got a new back door, the roof was painted, insulation was installed in the roof of the shelter house, and a new kitchen door was installed. Six windows were also framed in with wood and stained in the church. With its 36 acres, a pond, and six structures there is continual need for repairs and upkeep on a regular basis. We always welcome churches, who would send a work team to help.

FUM Field Staff


Thank you for remembering FUM Field Staff in your daily prayers:



USFW Friendly Flashes Do We Speak for Peace?

February 18 of this year a tragedy occurred because of a gun. Brandon Madren and Nathan Greene, had been best friends and grew up together in the nearby town of Redfield. Brandon had been in a relationship with Nathan's sister, and they had a child together. Then something happened and they separated. Nathan was upset with Brandon. He thought he wasn't being a good father, so he came over in a huff to Brandon's apartment in Adel.

Neighbor's heard Nathan kicking Brandon's door trying to break it down when Brandon would not let him in. Then he went down to the parking lot, and to emphasize his displeasure started jumping up and down on top of Brandon's car. Brandon got his rifle out of the closet and said he was just wanted to scare Nathan, but perhaps Nathan jumped up at the wrong time and Brandon shot Nathan in the chest. The afternoon ended tragically with Nathan dying and Brandon being arrested for 1st Degree Murder. At the ages 26 and 24, two young men's lives were destroyed because one of them chose to get out a gun.

The month of February was full of such tragedy around the country. At Chardin High School in Ohio on February 27, T. J. Lane, a troubled teenager stole a gun from his uncle. On his bus stop at Chardin on the way to his alternative High school, he randomly started shooting in the cafeteria; killing three students.

Also in Washington State, an eight year old girl was shot and critically injured when a nine year old brought a loaded gun he found laying around the house to school in his back pack.

Interestingly during this same time period lowa Legislators chose to introduce an amendment to the Constitution to the State of Iowa to make Iowa's gun laws the strongest in the nation. These new laws will make the right to acquire, posses, transport, carry and transfer for all legitimate purposes a fundamental right that cannot be denied, according to Chris Rager, a lobbyist of the National Rifle Association.

I was in West Des Moines at Evelyn Davis Community center yesterday and there was a big sign on the door that said NO GUNS ALLOWED! Our lowa laws alarmingly already allows people to go just about anywhere armed with a gun.

When Jesus was arrested, Peter was armed

with a sword which he drew and cut off the ear of one of the soldiers. Jesus said to Peter in Matt 26:52, "Put your sword away, for all who draw the sword will die by the sword."

Guns had not been invented when Jesus walked this earth, but I am sure that he would say today, "Put away your guns, for he who draws a gun will be killed by guns." We do not obtain peace by depending on guns to protect us, we obtain peace through trusting God. Jesus also said to his disciples, "My peace I leave with you. I do not give you as the world gives. Let not your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

Quakers historically have had a strong voice against bearing arms and against war. Margaret Fell is quoted speaking to King Charles II shortly after George Foxes arrest for refusing to bear arms in 1660. "All bloody principles and practices we do utterly deny, all outward wars and strife and fighting with outward weapons, for any end, or under any pretense whatsoever, and this is our testimony to the whole world. For the Spirit of Christ by which we are guided is not changeable, and we do certainly know and so testify to the world, that the Spirit of Christ which leads us into all Truth, will never move us to fight and war against any person with outward weapons neither for the Kingdom of Christ, nor the Kingdoms of this world."

Are we still today, as members of the Friends Church in lowa, a people who speak out for peace? Do we speak out against the current trend toward carrying a gun for self defense? Are we a voice assuring people around us that there is a better way? That there is no need to be afraid and take our protection in our own hand for Jesus is here to guide us in paths of peace. Being a peace maker is not a passive place of being. It is a call to action. Being a peace maker is a call to make the power of love stronger than the love of power.
