

The Whiteheads began their missionary service with MAF in Nicaragua. They then moved to Venezuela and after 11 years, accepted a new assignment as Program Manager in Shell, Ecuador, in 2005. Recently, Dan took on the new role of Regional Manager for MAF in Latin America, and shares, "I keep returning to God's promise in Isaiah 41:10 when I start to worry or fret about things. He is the One who keeps me and gives me strength." As with many ministries in this region, MAF programs in Latin America have moved toward nationalization, and he now has the privilege of working with national affiliate programs in Ecuador, Brazil, Suriname, Guatemala, and Mexico. He also continues to fly in Ecuador, helping the program there in that way. Away from the hangar, he continues to enjoy music and act as worship leader at their local church.

Tracey juggles a multitude of ministries, in addition to creating a loving Christian home for her family. The Ecuador program is steeped in mission history, and MAF has been there over 60 years. Many people still stop by to visit the Shell base because they were touched by the story of the 5 missionaries, including MAF pilot Nate Saint, killed by the Waorani Indians more than 50 years ago. Tracey helps the Shell base by coordinating the use of the guest apartments and the historic Nate Saint house. By purchasing supplies and coordinating their shipment to remote interior jungle sites, Tracey provides a valuable service to the interior jungle missionaries too. She also enjoys participating in the ladies Bible studies that are always available in the mission community.

Dr. Royce Frazier

President of Barclay College



Dr. Royce Frazier is the President of Barclay College, Haviland, Kansas. He is a graduate of Emporia State University and Barclay College. He earned his Masters degree in Marriage and Family Therapy (Clinical) from Friends University and received a Masters and a Ph.D. in psychology with an emphasis in clinical psychology from Fielding Graduate University in Santa Barbara, California.

Royce taught and coached before accepting the position of Superintendent of Youth Ministries for Evangelical Friends Church – Mid America (EFC-MA). Royce served in that capacity for the next 18 years and had opportunity to develop youth leaders, denominational camping ministries, ministry opportunities for teens, conferences, retreats, and our national youth conventions. He was Executive Director of Camp Quaker Haven and was privileged to chair the only international Youthquake convention.

Royce returned to Barclay College to create the *Barclay College Online* degree program and to serve as V.P for Academic Services. He was also instrumental in the initiation and accreditation of the new *Barclay College School for Graduate Studies*. He is an instructor in the Master of Arts in Transformational Leadership program.
