Servants in Training (S.I.T.'s)

The S.I.T.'s Program is a unique track for juniors in high school up to sophomores in college to be trained in Christian leadership and missions during the high school camp. These students will be given, throughout the day, Biblical application in leadership and then time to put their skills learned into practice. They will be behind the scenes of camp making sure that things are prepared and run smoothly for staff and campers to experience God more fully. Those in the program, will be a part of some activities with the other campers, but need to be willing to work hard and not be a part of everything the campers are.

Kelly Kellum Next General Secretary Of Friends United Meeting

The Board of Friends United

Meeting, in business sessions in Richmond, Indiana (USA), accepted the recommendation of the Search Committee to call Kelly Kellum as the next General Secretary of FUM. This recommendation followed an intensive search process including members from throughout the global fellowship of Friends.

Kelly was raised in Burundi, Africa, where his parents were missionaries with Mid-America Yearly Meeting. He is a graduate of Friends University and Asbury Theological Seminary. He served as a pastor among Friends for twenty years, most recently in North Carolina, and as presiding clerk of FUM for one triennium and on the Executive Committee of the FWCC—SOA. Most recently, Kelly has been working as a Stewardship Consultant, serving Quaker meetings and organizations on behalf of a new partnership between FUM and Everence Financial Services.

In his address to the board proceeding their deliberations and choice to call him as General Secretary, Kelly said that as a child of missionaries and a third-culture kid, he finds it difficult to say exactly where he is from. FUM, however, has become his spiritual home: "the place and the people where I belong."

Ron Bryan, clerk of FUM, says, "It would be hard to find anyone as well-prepared to lead an organization as diverse as Friends United meeting. Kelly's wide background, including his upbringing in Africa and his broad experience in many Yearly Meetings and in Friends United Meeting makes him an exciting choice, and we're glad that God has led him to this work at this time."

Colin Saxton said this about his successor: "Kelly's gifts, ability to build deep and meaningful relationships, his spiritual depth and love for FUM and Christ will serve the community and organization in important ways. With a fully-engaged board and staff working alongside him, FUM will be more faithful and fruitful in the future."

Colin will complete his service as General Secretary on June 30th, and Kelly will begin his service on July 1st.

2018 Summer Missions Project

Rebuilding a Friendly Place Puerto Padre, Cuba

On November 14th, 1900, four Quaker missionaries landed in Gibara, Cuba, to preach the Gospel. From that small beginning, the family of Friends that would become Cuba Yearly Meeting was born. Now, Cuba Yearly Meeting encompasses nine churches and four missions. There is a meeting in Havana, on the west side of the island, and the other churches and missions are in el Oriente—on the east side.



In the early 1900s, a school was started in the Cuban town of Puerto Padre by Quakers from Wilmington Yearly Meeting. They sent missionaries, met expenses, and, in 1905, were able to buy land to build a school. They sent a cablegram to Puerto Padre that read:

"Prepare to build—lot purchased"


By 1909, the school was finished and filled with students. Since it had been founded and funded by Friends from Wilmington Yearly Meeting, it became known as the Wilmington School—or, in Spanish, the Colegio Wilmington. The school building shared a common wall with the Puerto Padre Meetinghouse.

Life for Cuban Friends—and connections between Cuban Friends and Quakers throughout our beloved fellowship—changed dramatically after the Cuban Revolution of 1959. Cuba Yearly Meeting remained part of Friends United Meeting, but Friends there were isolated.

In 1961, all private schools in Cuba were nationalized—including the Wilmington School. Friends in Puerto Padre were able to maintain their Meetinghouse, on one side of the connecting wall, but the school on the other side fell into ruin.

Then, on February 22nd, 2014, the Cuban government agreed to return control of the Wilmington School to Cuba Yearly Meeting! It's in disrepair, but it's nothing that can't be rebuilt. That's our theme for this Summer Mission Project: **Rebuilding a Friendly Place.**

The churches around Iowa Yearly Meeting truly enjoyed getting acquainted with Shawn and Katrina McConaughneys. We rejoiced that they were 100% funded and able to arrive in Kisumu, Kenya in time for Easter. They were welcomed by Del and Suzanne Livingston who work with Infocus Pure Water Projects. Livingston's were living in their




house and preparing it for McConaughneys' arrival.

They are enjoying the plentiful fruit and learning to cook Kenyan dishes from Rose, the housekeeper. Identifying the new birds and flowers surrounding them is delightful. They are busy Skyping with kids, boss and support group. Of course, this is in between frequent power outages which they say teaches them to be flexible.

Shawn and Katrina are each attending the Men's and Women's expat Bible studies and attending Kisumu Friends Church on Easter. The Africa Ministries Office staff has welcomed them into their first staff meeting. They appreciate this dedicated staff and their work.

They are learning their way around town as they are learning to drive on the left side of the road. It is challenging since the turn signal and windshield wiper arms plus the steering wheel are on the right side of the vehicle. Driving aggressively is new to them also. They already received their first speeding ticket which is a common thing.

Prayer Requests are for safety, health, road conditions, and safety from other drivers. They have never lived abroad so they are figuring out how this looks for the long-haul. Missing family member and events is becoming a reality, also. Please lift Shawn and Katrina in their new work and new surroundings.
