IAYM Missions Board ~Serving in

Robert and Sarah Radcliff began serving in Cambodia in 2016 and have recently been on furlough, spending time in California and Iowa. Some of you may have had the opportunity to spent time with them while in Iowa, but if not, the Missions Board wants to provide you with insight into their ministry and equip you with ways to pray for them.

As you might imagine, being immersed in a foreign country can present challenges. For Robert and Sarah, learning the language has been difficult. The Khmer language (which is the language of the Cambodian people) is tied for 3rd as the hardest language to learn. For the first year and a half in the country, Sarah and Robert have devoted 40 hours a week to learning this language and continued to spend 30 hours a week after that. Learning the language has been a full—time job.

Being called to the mission field comes with blessings as well. Robert is often reminded of the Pearl of Great Price parable found in Matthew 13:45-46 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it." Robert shared that they have left their home and families and given up luxuries like drinkable water from the tap, and the ability to communicate, so that they might receive this pearl of great price, and it has been worth it. There is great joy in following the Lord where he leads. That joy of knowing and following Jesus Christ is the biggest blessing they have received as they minister to the

Khmer people.

When Robert and Sarah return, they will continue their work with the Friends church in Battambang. This church has had missionaries for nearly 25 years, and they are quickly coming to a point where they no longer need missionaries. When Robert and Sarah moved to Battambang in September of 2017, they were greeted by a missionary couple who had been there 3 years, and in Cambodia for 7 or so years. A few months

later, a single missionary woman joined them. Together the 3 units recognized that their time in Battambang needed to come to a close, so their teammates moved to a different part of Cambodia in September of 2018, leaving Robert and Sarah as the only Friends missionaries left in Battambang.

In addition to helping church in Battambang, they will take on the responsibility of overseeing the other Friends work in the area. This includes 2 church plants (a few hours outside the city in separate villages, Phnom Pruk, and Moung) and leading a few more bible studies. By this time next year, they hope to serve in a new part of Cambodia, that has not be served by missionaries.

As Robert and Sarah return to Cambodia, please pray for:

-The church in Battambang-- that she would stand strong without missionaries and that her pastor and elders would continue to be faithful.

Project Kuwesa, started in 2007 by Bill McCracken and his wife, Jean, works to empower the rural poor, especially widows raising children, to become self-sufficient. Kuwesa teaches skills and supplies materials & equipment to alleviate hunger, to create a source of clean water, and to build businesses.

Currently Bill is working to raise \$12,000 for these purposes:

- To purchase soil inputs to increase production of vegetables, especially to feed the children
- To purchase materials and pay for training & labor to create more biosand filters to produce clean water
- To run power to a new well so it will be operational

Funds are needed early in 2019 to support the rapidly growing demand for Kuwesa's services to help and empower the poorest of the poor. All the proceeds of this campaign will go to support Kuwesa. Thanks for donating!
